Church Council met on Monday 13 May. At this meeting:

- Church Council endorsed the audit reports for 2021-22 and 2022-23
- We discussed safe church requirements for parents in Oasis
- We received an email from the Moderator of the NSW/ACT Synod following the recent stabbing of a priest in the Assyrian Church in Sydney. It concerned emergency and risk plans. Church council will continue to look at our emergency response plans and will update you throughout the year
- Church Council has agreed that we will do an evacuation drill sometime this year
- Synod is running *Acknowledgement of Country* training over zoom on 30th May through Acknowledge this!
- Church Council also wants to publicise that Hugh does not work Wednesday it is his day
 off. It would be appreciated if we respect this sabbath

Sometimes children can be nervous going to Oasis and want Mum or Dad (or another adult caregiver) to go with them. It's great having parents there to support their child. And while there, we know that sometimes parents might co-incidentally also assist other children in activities. Church Council recently sought advice from the ACT Government on their requirements in those instances. We continue to welcome parents attending Oasis to support their child. However, based on that advice, we ask that unless you hold a Working With Vulnerable People's card, you limit your support to just your child.
